It's a New Year at St. Mary's!

THE CHURCH'S NEW YEAR IS NOVEMBER 27

Advent is an especially wonderful season. With the beginning of Advent we also begin a new liturgical year in the church. The First Sunday of Advent—Nov 27— was therefore the Church's New Year's Day!

Advent comes from the Latin word for an "arrival" or "coming." Advent means that the Lord is coming. It sounds a bit confusing for sure. First Jesus came to us at a specific time in history at Bethlehem about 2000 years ago. But in the great feast of Christmas, he comes to us again! And besides that, he is always with us—in our hearts, in the Eucharist, in all those we encounter every day—our family, friends, neighbors, and in the stranger, the needy, the suffering. Thus, during the next few months of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany, we prepare for and celebrate his coming again in this new year and are ready to welcome him when he does come, however that might be!

Here are some tips for preparing for advent by Henri J.M. Nouwen:

Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior. For you I wait all the long day, Because of your goodness, Lord. Psalm 25:5

Waiting is essential to the spiritual life. But waiting as a disciple of Jesus is not an empty waiting. It is a waiting with a promise in our hearts that makes already present to what we are waiting for. We wait during Advent for the birth of Jesus. We wait after Easter for the coming of the Spirit, and after the Ascension of Jesus we wait for his coming again in glory. We are always waiting, but it is a waiting in the conviction that we have already seen God's footsteps.

Waiting for God is an active, alert—yes, joyful—waiting. As we wait we remember him for whom we are waiting, and as we remember him we create a community ready to welcome him when he comes.

Lord, by your grace may I learn the art of waiting for you and your gifts with an eager and joyful heart.

Although there is much uncertainty in life, we all know there are certain events that we can count on: Easter, Christmas, reading this newsletter...

COMING SOON: CONFIRMATION CLASSES!

We at St. Mary's have just learned of our date for the Bishop's Visitation in 2006—which will be our Confirmation Date. It is set for a Sunday in November 2006. Thus, we will have two Confirmation Classes during the 2006 year! Exciting news!

Preparation for Confirmation is a spiritual journey that involves a large amount of time and preparation both inside and outside the classroom. Confirmation class is not just a "now your are in the seventh grade and we are going to teach you what we want you to know and then you will be confirmed" model but is an opportunity to explore who you are, and who God is in this world and to hear an invitation to say "yes"—for each young person to "confirm" their baptism and to decide to give themselves to God in Jesus Christ for the rest of their lives.

The first Confirmation Class will be for all youth currently in Grades 7 and up. Our clergy—Andrew, Tracy, and Jenn—will be the teachers for the Confirmation Classes in 2006. We will meet on Monday nights from 6-7:30pm at St.
